This month, we completed our 6th Annual Season of Service Food Drive. All three of our regions (North, Central and South) as well as our main Ewing Headquarters collected non-perishable food items throughout the months of November and December—totaling 3,907 items.

At Ewing Headquarters, 1,757 donated food items were delivered to Arm in Arm Food Bank in Trenton. Arm in Arm is a community-focused organization with a mission to achieve food, housing and employment stability for their neighbors in need.

Our South Region collected 762 donated items for the Food Bank of South Jersey, North Region collected 248 items for Market Street Mission in Morristown, and Central Region collected 1,140 items and delivered them to Fulfill Food Bank of Monmouth & Ocean Counties.

In addition, last month our staff generously donated **254** winter clothing items during our annual Winter Clothes Drive. Most of the items were delivered to HomeFront in Ewing—a non-profit organization in Lawrenceville dedicated to ending homelessness in Central Jersey. The residents at HomeFront received the coats just before the first winter storm of the season.

NJDOT is full of generous individuals—always going above and beyond to help when there is a need. I hope, at this point, that everyone knows **Commitment to Communities is our mission**—but those words only become meaningful when action supports them. NJDOT staff put meaning to the Commitment to Communities message through hard work in their day-to-day responsibilities and dedication to their local communities.

Thank you so much to everyone who donated and to the organizations that serve their communities every day.
