I-76 eastbound Exit 1B ramp to I-295 northbound to be closed Saturday morning for inspection

Three lanes out of five lanes in the I-295 northbound covered roadway to be closed

(Trenton) - New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) officials today announced the closure of the I-76 eastbound Exit 1B ramp to I-295 northbound and the closure of one lane on I-295 northbound as part the Direct Connection project in Camden and Gloucester counties.

Beginning at 5 a.m., Saturday, April 4 until 10 a.m., NJDOT's contractor, Conti Enterprises, Inc., is scheduled to close and detour the I-76 eastbound Exit 1B ramp to I-295 northbound. In addition, the left lane on I-295 northbound will be closed at Exit 27. This will allow the left three lanes in the covered roadway to be closed for inspection. Two right lanes on I-295 northbound will be maintained from Exit 27 through the covered roadway. The following detour will be in place:

I-76 eastbound to I-295 northbound detour

(Saturday, April 4 from 5 a.m. until 10 a.m.)

- Motorists traveling on I-76 eastbound wishing to take I-295 northbound will be directed to continue on I-76 eastbound
- Stay to the left and take Exit 1A to I-295 southbound
- Take I-295 southbound to Exit 25A/Route 47
- Take the exit to I-295 northbound

The work is part of the \$900 million Direct Connection project that will provide a seamless route for I-295 motorists traveling through the interchange of I-295, I-76, and Route 42. The Direct Connection project has been divided into four construction contracts, with completion expected in the fall of 2024. NJDOT's project website provides <u>construction activity schedules and updates</u>.

The precise timing of the work is subject to change due to weather or other factors.
