Route 130 lane closures required as a road and bridge deck improvements project begins in Burlington County The project will enhance safety along nearly nine miles of road

(Trenton) - New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) officials today announced the start of a Route 130 Intersection and Bridge Deck Improvements project that spans the towns of Edgewater Park, Willingboro, Burlington, and Florence in Burlington County. The project will make improvements to nearly nine miles of road between CR 630/Cooper Street/Charleston Road in Edgewater Park and Hornberger Avenue in Florence.

Beginning at 9 a.m., Monday, August 10 until 3 p.m., and continuing daily, NJDOT's contractor South State, is scheduled to close the shoulder or one lane of traffic on Route 130 between Hornberger Avenue and Delaware Avenue/Florence-Columbus Avenue/CR 656 in Florence. Route 130 work will alternate between the southbound and northbound directions as required.

Lane closures are necessary to install underground electrical conduit for Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) improvements that will be installed at 20 intersections within the project limits. This stage of work will continue on Route 130 through the spring of 2021.

The \$28.1 million Route 130 Intersection and Bridge Deck Improvements project will mill and pave 8.6 miles of road, repair bridge decks, and make electrical and traffic signal upgrades with Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) equipment at 20 intersections. In addition, the project will install ADA ramps, pedestrian safety devices and upgrade guiderail. The project is expected to be completed in fall 2023.

Variable Message Signs are being used to provide advance notification of all traffic pattern changes associated with the project. The precise timing of the work is subject to change due to weather or other factors.
