Alternating traffic required at Route 130/Hollywood Avenue roundabout this weekend as intersection improvement project nears completion in Carney's Point

Final paving and roadway striping will be completed overnight

(Trenton) – New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) officials today announced two nights of alternating traffic at the newly-constructed Route 130/Hollywood Avenue roundabout as an intersection improvement project nears completion in Carney's Point, Salem County.

Beginning at 7 p.m. tonight, October 30, until 6 a.m. Saturday, October 31, and again from 8 p.m. Saturday until 6 a.m. Sunday, November 1, NJDOT's contractor is scheduled to set up alternating traffic at the Route 130/Hollywood Avenue/CR 618 roundabout. This will allow the contractor to complete paving work and apply temporary road striping.

Following the completion of this overnight work, the Hollywood Avenue/CR 618 detour and the Route 130 southbound truck detour will be removed. An additional night of alternating traffic will be required next week to complete permanent roadway striping.

The \$1.9 million state-funded project constructed a modern roundabout to improve safety at the intersection of Route 130 and Hollywood Avenue in Carney's Point, Salem County. The roundabout increases visibility and provides an improved speed transition between rural (50 mph) and urban (35 mph) portions of Route 130.
