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Route 17 northbound lane closures this week for priority bridge repairs in Hasbrouck Heights, Bergen County Left lane will reopen Thursday and right lane will be closed Friday

(Trenton) – New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) officials today announced lane closures on Route 17 northbound near the Route 46 overpass in Hasbrouck Heights this week as a priority bridge repair project advances in Bergen County.

Beginning at 9 a.m. tomorrow, Thursday, November 5, until 3 p.m., NJDOT's contractor, I.E.W. Construction Group, is scheduled to close the center lane on Route 17 northbound near the Route 46 overpass in Hasbrouck Heights, Bergen County. This closure will allow the contractor to remove construction barrier in the left lane following the completion of concrete repairs on that side of the overpass. One lane of northbound traffic will be maintained throughout the day. The center and left lanes will reopen by 3 p.m.

Beginning at 9 a.m. Friday, November 6, until 3 p.m., the right and center lanes on Route 17 northbound are scheduled to be closed. These closures will allow the contractor to place construction barrier in the right lane, creating a work zone to complete to complete concrete repairs on that side of the overpass. One lane of northbound traffic will be maintained throughout the day. The center lane will reopen by 3 p.m., and the right lane will remain closed for approximately two months.

If work is completed early, the road will reopen sooner. The precise timing of the work is subject to change due to weather or other factors.
