Commercial Vehicle Travel Restrictions Lifted on all Interstate highways as of 10 pm tonight Motorists urged to use caution as roads are wet and may be slippery

(Trenton) – New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) officials announced the Commercial Vehicle Travel Restriction will be lifted effective at 10 pm tonight, Thursday, February 18 for all highways.

All vehicles previously listed in the restriction are able to resume normal travel on the following highways in both directions:

- I-78, from the Pennsylvania border to I-95 (New Jersey Turnpike)
- I-80, from the Pennsylvania border to I-95 (New Jersey Turnpike)
- I-195, from I-295 to NJ Route 138
- I-280, from I-80 to I-95 (New Jersey Turnpike)
- I-287, from NJ Route 440 to the New York State border
- I-295, from Exit 60 (I-195) north to the Scudders Falls Bridge (Pennsylvania border)
- NJ Route 440, from the Outerbridge Crossing to I-287

Interstate and State highways are in good condition, but roads are wet and may be slippery. Use caution as there is a chance of refreeze and icing. Road conditions can change quickly. Our crews will work through the night to make sure roads are in good condition for tomorrow morning's commute. Motorists are encouraged to slow down, plan extra travel time, and maintain a safe following distance from other vehicles. Stay clear of spreaders and emergency responders so they are able to do their jobs safely.

NJDOT will be using Variable Message Signs throughout the storm to provide updates.
