## Route 322/East Black Horse Pike and Route 206 roadway improvement project begins in Atlantic County Closures required for concrete repairs

**(Trenton)** – New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) officials today announced the start of a roadway and sidewalk improvement project on Route 322/East Black Horse Pike and Route 206 in Folsom, Hamilton, and Hammonton, Atlantic County.

Beginning at 7:30 a.m., Monday, March 1 until 4:30 p.m., NJDOT's Contractor, Arawak Paving Co., is scheduled to install construction signs and complete markout for sidewalk construction along Route 322/East Black Horse as part of a moving operation between Cherokee Road and South Pinewood Drive in Folsom, Atlantic County. Most of the work will take place behind the curb, but occasional lane closures and traffic shifts may be required during the day. At least one lane of traffic will be maintained in both directions at all times. Motorists are advised to slow down and use caution in the work zone.

Additional shoulder and lane closures will be required in the coming weeks on Route 322/East Black Horse Pike in Folsom, Atlantic County and Route 206 in Hammonton, Atlantic County to allow for sidewalk construction.

The \$3.1 million improvement project includes the construction of sidewalks and ADA compliant ramps along Route 322/East Black Horse Pike in Folsom and Route 206 in Hammonton. It also includes milling and paving and traffic signal improvements. The project is anticipated to be complete by fall 2021.

The precise timing of the work is subject to change due to weather or other factors.
