North 4th Street and East Pine Street to be closed for railroad crossing repairs in Millville Necessary safety work will require detours

(Trenton) – New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) officials today announced the start of a railroad crossing rehabilitation project that will require a nine-day closure and detour of North 4th Street and East Pine Street in Millville, Cumberland County.

Beginning at 7 a.m., tomorrow, Thursday, April 15, until 7 a.m. Friday, April 23, North 4th Street and East Pine Street are scheduled to be closed and detoured in both directions at the railroad crossing. Construction will remove the existing railroad crossing and replace it with a new concrete crossing, as well as new asphalt approaches for a safer and smoother railroad crossing. Local access will be maintained for residents and businesses. The following signed detours will be in place:

East Pine Street westbound detour:

- Motorists traveling westbound on East Pine Street will be directed to turn right onto North 5th Street
- Turn left onto East Mulberry Street
- Turn left onto North 3rd Street
- Turn right onto East Pine Street

East Pine Street eastbound detour:

- Motorists traveling eastbound on East Pine Street will be directed to turn right onto North 3rd Street
- Turn left onto Sassafras Street
- Turn left onto North 5th Street
- Turn right onto East Pine Street

North 4th Street northbound detour:

- Motorists traveling northbound on North 4th Street will be directed to turn right onto Sassafras Street
- Turn left onto North 5th Street
- Turn left onto East Mulberry Street
- Turn right onto North 4th Street

North 4th Street southbound detour:

- Motorists traveling southbound on North 4th Street will be directed to turn right onto East Mulberry Street
- Turn left onto North 3rd Street
- Turn left onto Sassafras Street
- Turn right onto North 4th Street

Traffic detours will be coordinated with the local police. The road will be reopened if work is completed earlier than planned.

This federally-funded project is included within NJDOT's railroad grade-crossing safety program, which repairs, upgrades, or removes approximately 30 crossings each year, statewide.
