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Route 322 traffic signal testing to begin tomorrow as roadway widening project advances in Gloucester County New signals will be fully operational next week

(Trenton) – New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) officials today announced the activation of two new traffic signals on Route 322 as a roadway widening project advances in Logan Township, Gloucester County.

Beginning at 10 a.m. tomorrow, Thursday, May 6, the developer's contractor, R.E. Pierson Construction Co., is scheduled to activate two new traffic signals located at the Route 322/Crossroads Boulevard intersection (located at the entrance to the Logan North Industrial Park) in Logan Township, Gloucester County. The new signals will remain in "flashing mode" for several days for testing.

Testing is expected to be complete and the signals will be fully operational by Monday morning, May 10.

The project is improving a 1.2 mile section of Route 322 between Route 130 and I-295 in Logan Township, Gloucester County. The original roadway featured one lane in each direction, with three foot shoulders. The new roadway will feature two lanes in each direction, with upgraded 12-foot shoulders. It will also upgrade traffic signals and improved access to local businesses. The project is anticipated to be complete in spring 2021.
