## Route 130 left lane closures required tonight as roadway improvement project advances in Burlington County Lane closures will remain in place for 2.5 months

**(Trenton)** – New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) officials today announced lane closures on Route 130 in both directions as a roadway improvement project advances in Burlington County.

Beginning at 8 p.m. tonight, Monday, June 21, NJDOT's contractor, South State, is scheduled to close the left lanes on Route 130 in both directions between Cooper Street/Charleston Road/CR 630 in Edgewater Township and Salem Road in Burlington City, and between Jacksonville Road/East Federal Street and Frontage Road in Burlington City. These closures will allow the contractor to install construction barrier in the median, creating a work zone to replace median inlets and install concrete footings for new dynamic messaging signs (DMS) signs. At least two lanes will be maintained in both directions. These closures are anticipated to remain in place for approximately 2.5 months.

The \$28.1 million Route 130 Intersection and Bridge Deck Improvements project will mill and pave 8.6 miles of road, repair bridge decks, and make electrical and traffic signal upgrades with Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) equipment at 20 intersections. In addition, the project will install ADA ramps, pedestrian safety devices and upgrade guiderail. The project is expected to be completed in fall 2023.

The precise timing of the work is subject to change due to weather or other factors.
