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Route 206 lane and shoulder closures required as pavement improvements project begins in Morris County Alternating traffic pattern required for paving

(Trenton) – New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) officials today announced the start of a pavement rehabilitation project on Route 206 in Chester, Mount Olive, and Roxbury in Morris County.

Beginning at 8 p.m. tonight, Tuesday, August 24 until 6 a.m. the next day, and continuing Monday through Friday for the next few weeks, NJDOT's Contractor, Asphalt Paving Systems is scheduled to close one lane of traffic on Route 206 northbound between Furnace Road in Chester and I-80 in Roxbury for reflector removal as part of a moving operation. The work is in preparation for milling and paving of the roadway. Upon completion of work in the northbound lanes, work will continue on Route 206 southbound.

When paving begins in a few weeks, alternating traffic will be required overnight on single-lane portions of the roadway. In addition, overnight ramp closures will be required for paving as the project progresses.

The \$2.8 million federally-funded project is designed to extend the pavement life, improve safety, and enhance ride quality for motorists on approximately 14 miles of Route 206 in both directions between Furnace Road in Chester and I-80 in Roxbury. The project is scheduled to be completed in the fall of 2021.

The precise timing of the work is subject to change due to weather or other factors.
