Route 30 westbound traffic shifted to eastbound lanes for pavement project in Camden and Atlantic counties One lane of traffic to be maintained in each direction during closures

(Trenton) – New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) officials today announced a portion of Route 30 westbound will be closed today with traffic shifted to the eastbound lanes as a pavement repair project advances on Route 30 in Camden and Atlantic counties.

Beginning at 7 a.m. today, Friday April 22, until 3:30 p.m., NJDOT's contractor, A.E. Stone, closed Route 30 westbound between Spring Road and Fleming Pike in Winslow and shifted traffic onto the eastbound side of the roadway. One lane in each direction will be maintained during construction. Route 30 normally carries two lanes of traffic in each direction.

Drainage work has been completed on the eastbound side of the road, and work will now shift to the westbound side of the road. One lane of traffic will be maintained in each direction through the spring. Two lanes of traffic in each direction will be restored for the summer.

In addition, there will be temporary lane closures for intersection improvements through the spring. Work is expected to begin at the intersection of Route 30 and Atco Avenue in Waterford, Camden County and progress toward Route 206 in Hammonton, Atlantic County.

The \$11.2 million state-funded project will repair 10 miles of pavement on Route 30 from Atco Avenue in Waterford, Camden County to Route 206 in Hammonton, Atlantic County. The project will advance in stages, beginning with drainage work in Winslow. Paving is expected to take place in the spring 2023. In addition to pavement repairs, the project includes traffic signal upgrades, ADA-compliant ramps, and guiderail upgrades. The project is expected to be completed in fall 2023.
