Route 46 westbound ramps to Route 17 to be closed and detoured tonight in Hasbrouck Heights Closures required for paving

(Trenton) – New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) officials today announced that the Route 46 westbound ramps to Route 17 northbound and southbound will be closed tonight for paving in Hasbrouck Heights, Bergen County.

Beginning at 10 p.m. tonight, Wednesday, September 14, until 6 a.m. tomorrow, Thursday, September 15, NJDOT's contractor, Joseph M. Sanzari, Inc., is scheduled to close and detour the Route 46 westbound ramps to Route 17 northbound and southbound. The closures are necessary for paving. The following detours will be in place:

Route 46 westbound ramp to Route 17 northbound detour:

- Motorists on Route 46 westbound wishing to take the ramp to Route 17 northbound/Paramus will be directed to keep left to continue on Route 46 westbound
- Take the ramp to Burton Avenue, just west of the overpass over Terrace Avenue
- Turn right onto Pasadena Avenue
- Turn left onto Terrace Avenue
- Turn left to take the ramp onto Route 17 northbound

Route 46 westbound ramp to Route 17 southbound detour:

- Motorists on Route 46 westbound wishing to take the ramp to Route 17 southbound/Newark will be directed to continue on Route 46 westbound
- Take the ramp to Collins Ave, just west of the pedestrian bridge overpassing Route
 46
- Turn left onto Pasadena Avenue
- Turn right onto Boulevard
- Turn right onto West Pleasantville Avenue
- Turn right onto Route 17 southbound

The \$8.8 million federally-funded Route 46, Bergen Boulevard to Main Street roadway improvement project will resurface approximately two miles of Route 46 in Lodi, Hasbrouck Heights, and Teterboro, Bergen County. The project also includes the installation of ADA-compliant curbs and ramps, as well as traffic signal upgrades. The project is expected to be complete in summer 2022.
