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Route 4 lane closures required this week for concrete removal in Englewood, Bergen County Jones Road southbound to be closed Tuesday morning

(Trenton) – New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) officials today announced lane closures on Route 4 this week, as part of the Jones Road over Route 4 bridge replacement project in Englewood, Bergen County. In addition, Jones Road southbound will be closed Tuesday with alternating traffic maintained on Jones Road northbound.

Monday, December 12 and Tuesday, December 13

Beginning at 11 p.m. tonight, Monday, December 12, until 4:30 a.m., Tuesday, December 13 and again on Tuesday night at the same times, two left lanes on Route 4 eastbound will be closed underneath the Jones Road Bridge over Route 4 for concrete removal.

In addition, from 9 a.m. until 3 p.m. Tuesday, December 13, Jones Road southbound is scheduled to be closed on the Jones Road Bridge over Route 4 to install utility poles. Alternating traffic will be maintained on Jones Road northbound during construction.

Wednesday, December 14 and Thursday, December 15

Beginning at 10 p.m. Wednesday, December 14, until 6 a.m., Thursday, December 15 and again on Thursday night at the same times, the left lane on Route 4 eastbound and the left lane on Route 4 westbound will be closed underneath the Jones Road Bridge over Route 4 for concrete removal.

Friday, December 16

Beginning at 11 p.m. Friday, December 16, until 7 a.m., Saturday, December 17, the right lane on Route 4 westbound will be closed underneath the Jones Road Bridge over Route 4 for concrete removal.

At least one lane of traffic will be maintained on Route 4 in each direction during construction. Motorists are advised to slow down, use caution, and expect delays or plan an alternate route.

The \$20.7 million federally-funded project will replace the Jones Road Bridge over Route 4 in Englewood Bergen County. The new bridge will be approximately three feet higher to improve under-clearance issues on Route 4. Work is expected to be complete in the summer of 2025.
