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Route 4 lane closures required this week for concrete removal in Englewood, Bergen County **At least one lane of traffic will be maintained in each direction**

(Trenton) – New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) officials today announced lane closures on Route 4 this week, as part of the Jones Road over Route 4 bridge replacement project in Englewood, Bergen County,

Monday, December 19 and Tuesday, December 20

Beginning at 10 p.m. tonight, Monday, December 19, until 6 a.m., Tuesday, December 20 and again on Tuesday night at the same times, the left lane on Route 4 eastbound and the left lane on Route 4 westbound will be closed underneath the Jones Road Bridge over Route 4 for concrete removal.

Wednesday, December 21 and Thursday, December 22

Beginning at 11 p.m. Wednesday, December 21, until 6 a.m., Thursday, December 22 and again on Thursday night at the same times, the right lane on Route 4 westbound will be closed underneath the Jones Road Bridge over Route 4 for concrete removal.

At least one lane of traffic will be maintained on Route 4 in each direction during construction. Motorists are advised to slow down, use caution, and expect delays or plan an alternate route.

The \$20.7 million federally-funded project will replace the Jones Road Bridge over Route 4 in Englewood Bergen County. The new bridge will be approximately three feet higher to improve under-clearance issues on Route 4. Work is expected to be complete in the summer of 2025.

The precise timing of the work is subject to change due to weather or other factors.
