Spring Garden Road/Route 143 to be closed for railroad crossing repairs beginning tomorrow in Winslow Detours necessary during construction

(Trenton) – Spring Garden Road/Route 143 is scheduled to be closed and detoured beginning tomorrow between South Egg Harbor Road and Park Drive for railroad crossing repairs in Winslow, Camden County.

Beginning at 7 a.m. tomorrow, Tuesday, August 13, until 7 a.m. Friday, August 16, Spring Garden Road/Route 143 will be closed in both directions from South Egg Harbor Road to Park Drive to remove and reconstruct the existing railroad crossing and approaches. Access will be maintained for local traffic. The following detours will be in place:

Spring Garden Road/Route 143 northbound Detour:

- Traffic on Hay Road/Route 143 northbound, which becomes Spring Garden Road, will be directed to turn left onto South Egg Harbor Road
- Stay right to take the ramp to Route 73 northbound
- Turn right onto Waterford Blue Anchor Road
- Turn right onto East Central Avenue, back to Spring Garden Road/Route 143

Spring Garden Road/Route 143 southbound Detour:

- Traffic on Spring Garden Road/Route 143 southbound will be directed to turn right onto East Central Avenue
- Turn left onto Route 73 southbound
- Stay left to take the ramp to South Egg Harbor Road, back to Spring Garden Road/Route 143, which becomes Hay Road

In order to provide safer and smoother railroad crossing, the existing crossing will be replaced with new concrete crossings and asphalt approaches. This federally funded project is included within NJDOT's railroad grade-crossing safety program which repairs, upgrades, or removes approximately 50 crossings each year, statewide.
