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I-295 northbound and Route 42 northbound Exit 1B to I-295 northbound to be closed for several nights in Bellmawr Closures Friday, Monday, and Tuesday nights for paving I-295 northbound

(Trenton) – I-295 northbound and the Route 42 northbound Exit 1B to I-295 northbound are scheduled to be closed and detoured tonight, Monday, and Tuesday nights for paving work, as the Direct Connection project advances in Bellmawr, Camden County.

I-295 northbound Closure

Beginning at 8 p.m. tonight, Friday, September 6 until 8 a.m. Saturday, September 7, and again on Monday, September 9 and Tuesday, September 10 from 8 p.m. until 5 a.m. the next day, the two right lanes on I-295 northbound will be closed and detoured after Creek Road, with traffic directed to stay left toward I-76/Camden/Philadelphia. The following detour will be in place:

I-295 northbound detour:

- Motorists traveling on I-295 northbound will be directed to take old Exit 26/new Exit 27A (left exit), which becomes the left lane of I-76 westbound
- Take I-76 westbound to Exit 2/I-676 northbound
- Take I-676 northbound to Exit 1/Collings Avenue
- Turn right onto Collings Avenue
- Turn left onto I-676 southbound, which becomes I-76 eastbound
- Take I-76 eastbound to Exit 1B/I-295 northbound

Route 42 northbound Closure

Beginning at 8 p.m. tonight, Friday, September 6 until 8 a.m. Saturday, September 7, and again on Monday, September 9 and Tuesday, September 10 from 8 p.m. until 5 a.m. the next day, the right lane on Route 42 northbound is scheduled to be closed after Exit 14B/Benigo Boulevard and the Route 42 northbound Exit 1B to I-295 northbound is scheduled to be closed and detoured. The following detour will be in place:

Route 42 northbound Exit 1B ramp to I-295 northbound detour:

- Motorists traveling on Route 42 northbound wishing to take Exit 1B to I-295 northbound will be directed to continue on Route 42 northbound to I-76 westbound
- Take I-76 westbound to Exit 2/I-676 northbound
- Take I-676 northbound to Exit 1/Collings Avenue
- Turn right onto Collings Avenue
- Turn left onto I-676 southbound, which becomes I-76 eastbound
- Take I-76 eastbound to Exit 1B/I-295 northbound

The closures are necessary to repave a portion of I-295 northbound near the temporary Browning Road Bridge. The traffic shifts are necessary to create a median work zone to begin work on the second of two piers for the new Browning Road Bridge. The two right lanes on I-295 were shifted to the right on Wednesday morning.

Route 42 northbound Exit 1B Oversized Truck Detour

Traffic coming from the Route 42 Exit 1B ramp toward I-295 northbound was also shifted to the right on Wednesday and is in a single lane cattle chute with construction barrier on either side requiring an oversized truck detour. This configuration will be in place for approximately one week. The following detour will remain in place for oversized trucks:

Route 42 northbound Exit 1B ramp to I-295 northbound Oversized Truck detour:

- Oversized trucks traveling on Route 42 northbound wishing to take Exit 1B to I-295 northbound will be directed to continue on Route 42 northbound to I-76 westbound
- Take I-76 westbound to Exit 2/I-676 northbound
- Take I-676 northbound to Exit 1/Collings Avenue
- Turn right onto Collings Avenue
- Turn left onto I-676 southbound, which becomes I-76 eastbound
- Take I-76 eastbound to Exit 1B/I-295 northbound

The work is part of the Direct Connection project that will provide a seamless route for I-295 motorists traveling through the interchange of I-295, I-76, and Route 42. To sign up for I-295 Direct Connect project updates go to 295DirectConnect.com or text CONNECT to 1-844-844-3681.

Portable variable message signs are being utilized to provide advance notification to the public of all traffic pattern changes associated with the work. The precise timing of the work is subject to change due to weather or other factors.
