## Old Marlton Pike to be closed tonight in both directions in Cherry Hill, Camden County and Evesham, Burlington County Closure expected to remain in place for the next several weeks

**(Trenton)** – Old Marlton Pike is scheduled to be closed tonight between Conestoga Drive in Cherry Hill and Marlton Village Road in Evesham for drainage improvements as a pavement preservation project advances in Camden and Burlington counties.

Beginning at 8 p.m. tonight, Friday, October 18, until 6 a.m. tomorrow, Saturday, October 19, Old Marlton Pike eastbound and westbound are scheduled to be closed from Conestoga Drive to Marlton Village Road. The closure is necessary to install drainage pipe and construct a headwall. The following detours are expected to remain in place for approximately one month:

## **Old Marlton Pike eastbound Detour:**

- Motorists on Old Marlton Pike eastbound will be directed to turn left onto Conestoga Drive
- Turn right onto Route 70 eastbound
- Turn right onto North Cropwell Road, back to Old Marlton Pike

## **Old Marlton Pike westbound Detour:**

- Motorists on Old Marlton Pike westbound will be directed to turn right onto North Cropwell Road
- Turn left onto Route 70 westbound
- Turn right onto Conestoga Drive
- Turn left to take the jughandle to Old Marlton Pike/U and Left Turns
- Cross over Route 70, back to Old Marlton Pike

The work is part of a \$155.1 million state-funded Route 70 corridor safety and improvement project that will upgrade traffic signals at 27 intersections, replace or install four Dynamic Message Signs, improve drainage, sidewalks, and resurface approximately 9 miles of Route 70 between Route 38 in Cherry Hill and Cooper Avenue in Evesham. In addition to milling and paving Route 70, the North Maple Avenue loop ramps and the Route 70/Route 73 interchange ramps will be repaved as well. The project is expected to be completed by winter 2026.
